NAVAJO INDIAN MULTI-COLOR AFGHAN

Barbara Johnson

For afghan 72 x 52, chain 285. Use F Crochet Hook. Do not turn work. Leave a 4" end of yarn at beginning and end of rows for fringe. Navajo colors are: black, red, gray, and white. You need 2 skeins of black, 4 skeins red (Jockey), 4 skeins of sparkling black, and 4 skeins sparkling white. Use Red Heart Yarn.

All scs are made in back loop of stitches. All dcs are made in the front loop of st and in the second row from one being worked on. You start with Black for the border and chain 285 and break yarn.

BLACK-- Rows 1 through 5-- sc in each st across with border color.
Row 6 -- sc in 2 sc 1 dc (19 sc 1 dc) end with 2 sc.

RED-- Row 7: 3 sc 1 dc (17 sc, 1 dc, 1 sc, 1 dc) end with 3 sc.
Row 8: 4 sc 1 dc (15 sc, 1 dc, 3 sc, 1 dc) end with 4 sc.
Row 9: 5 sc 1 dc (13 sc, 1 dc, 5 sc, 1 dc) end with 5 sc.

GRAY-- Row 10: 6 sc, 1 dc (11 sc, 1 dc, 7 sc, 1 dc) end with 6 sc.
Row 11: 7 sc, 1 dc (9 sc, 1 dc, 9 sc, 1 dc) end with 7 sc.
Row 12: 8 sc, 1 dc (7 sc, 1 dc, 11 sc, 1 dc) end with 8 sc.

WHITE-- Row 13: 9 sc, 1 dc (5 sc, 1 dc, 13 sc, 1 dc) end with 9 sc.
Row 14: 10 sc, 1 dc (3 sc, 1 dc, 15 sc, 1 dc) end with 10 sc.
Row 15: 11 sc, 1 dc (1 sc, 1 dc, 17 sc, 1 dc) end with 11 sc.

BLACK-- Row 16: 12 sc, 1 dc (19 sc, 1 dc) end with 12 sc.

Repeat rows-- 15, 14, 13.

Repeat rows-- 12, 11, 10.

Repeat rows-- 9, 8, 7.

Repeat row-- 6, then begin pattern again with row 7.

When afghan reaches desired size, repeat rows 1 through 5 after row 6 to complete your border

For smaller afghan to equal 60", chain 205.

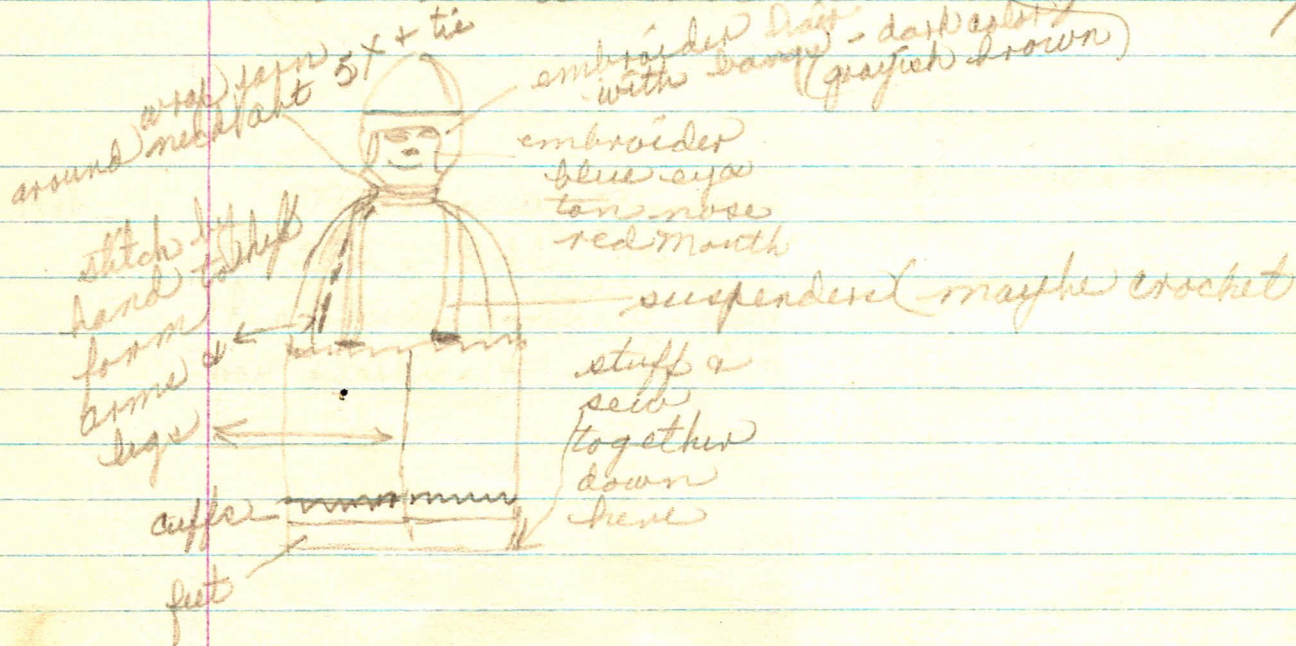

Chain 1, turn, 1 single crochet in next stitch, 2 single crochet in next stitch, continue across increasing 1 stitch in every 3rd stitch, chain 2, turn. One double crochet in each stitch across chain 1 and turn. Single crochet across increasing 1 stitch in every 4th stitch. Chain 2, turn and make one double crochet in each stitch across. For child's poncho break thread, for adult poncho chain 1, single crochet across increasing 1 stitch in every 5th stitch. Chain 2, turn and make 1 double crochet in each stitch across, break thread.

Count one half the stitches, join thread in center stitch, chain 2, one double crochet in same space, one double crochet in each remaining stitch to end, hold 2 ends together as one stitch, make 4 stitches in that one, 1 double crochet in every stitch to center back, 2 double crochets in beginning stitch. Every row thereafter begin each row with chain 2, 1 double crochet in same space. Crochet 1 double crochet in every stitch to center front, make 4 double crochets in center front, 1 double crochet in remaining stitches to center back, 2 double crochets in beginning stitch and join. Continue rows of stitches until poncho reaches within 4 inches of the wrist at the side, finish with row of single crochet, break thread and add fringe.

One may make bands of contrasting color at edge of yoke and around bottom. May use mixed colors of thread for fringe.

SHELL STITCH PONCHO (ADULT)

Make yoke for adult poncho.

Begin pattern with chain 5, double C in same stitch, skip 2 stitches,

1 dbl C, ch 1, 1 dbl C in same stitch all around.

Second row slip stitch into v stitch, ch 5, dbl c into same space, ch 1,

dbl c into center of next v stitch, ch 1, dbl c into same space, ch 1

around joining to 3rd stitch of chain 5 in center back.

Remaining rows are as follows:

Slip stitch into space, ch 3, dbl c into space, ch 1, 2 dbl c into space, ch 1,

3 dbl c in each, ch 1 space between v stitches to center front. In center

front v stitch make 2 dbl c, ch 1, 2 dbl c ch 1 continue.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

GAUGE

Correct gauge is essential for proper size of garment. Needle sizes given in instructions are merely guides and should never be used without first making a sample swatch approximately square in the stitch, yarn, and needle specified. Then measure it, counting your stitches carefully. If you have more stitches per inch than specified, try again with a larger size needle; if fewer, try again with a smaller size. Keep trying until you find the size that will give you the specified gauge. **DO NOT HESITATE TO CHANGE NEEDLE SIZE TO OBTAIN CORRECT GAUGE.**

ADDING NEW STITCHES

Turn work around so needles are reversed, then insert right needle into stitch as to knit, yarn over, and pull loop through (Fig. 1a), slip loop just worked back onto left needle (Fig. 1b). Repeat for required number of stitches.

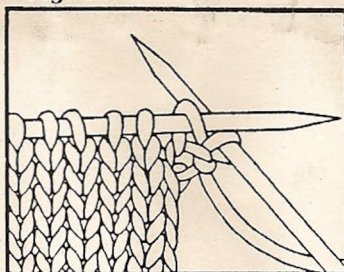
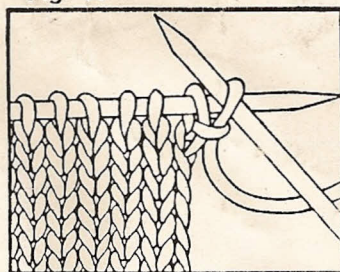

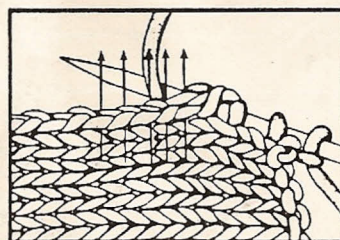


PICKING UP STITCHES

When instructed to pick up stitches, insert the needle under two strands at the edge of the worked piece.

Put the yarn around the needle and pull it through, making a stitch on the needle. Repeat along the edge, picking up the required number of stitches (Fig. 2). A crochet hook may be helpful to pull yarn through.

Size Note: Instructions are written for size Small with Medium and Large sizes in parentheses. Sweaters are designed with at least 3" ease at the bust. Instructions will be easier to read, if you circle all the numbers pertaining to your size.

MATERIALS: Worsted weight yarn, approximately:
10(11-12) ounces, [280(310-340) grams] with Sleeves or
9(10-11) ounces, [260(280-310) grams] without Sleeves
Straight knitting needles, sizes 9 (5.5 mm) and
15 (10.0 mm) or sizes needed for gauge
Yarn needle

GAUGE: With larger size needles in Stockinette Stitch,
3 stitches = 1"

BODY

RIBBING

Using smaller size needles cast on 52(58-64) stitches loosely. Work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for 2½".

FRONT

Change to larger size needles.

Row 1: Knit across.

Row 2: Purl across.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 13" from cast on edge or desired length to underarm, ending by working a right side row.

LACE YOKE

Row 1 (Wrong side row): Knit 1, ★ yarn over, knit 2 together; repeat from ★ across to last stitch, knit 1.

Row 2: Knit across.

Row 3: Knit 2, ★ yarn over, knit 2 together; repeat from ★ across.

Row 4: Knit across.

Repeat Rows 1-4 until Yoke measures approximately 6¾(7¼-7¾)". Change to smaller size needles. Continue working in established pattern for 1" more, ending by working Row 4.

Next Row: Work across 9(13-15) stitches in established pattern, bind off 33(31-33) stitches very loosely in knit for Neck, ★ yarn over, knit 2 together; repeat from ★ to last stitch, knit 1.

Next Row: Knit across to bound off stitches, add on 33(31-33) stitches loosely for Neck (Figs. 1a & 1b), knit remaining stitches: 52(58-64) stitches.

Continue working in Lace Yoke pattern for 1" more. Change to larger size needles. Continue working in established pattern until Yoke measures approximately 7¾(8¼-8¾)". ending by working a right side row.

BACK

Row 1: Purl across.

Row 2: Knit across.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, until piece measures 10½" from Yoke

RIBBING

Change to smaller size needles. Work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for 2½". Bind off loosely; cut yarn.

Optional Armhole Ribbing:

With right side facing and using smaller size needles, pick up 80(84-88) stitches evenly along Yoke edge (Fig. 2). Work in K1, P1 ribbing for 1". Bind off loosely in ribbing; cut yarn.

Repeat for second Armhole.

SLEEVE

With right side facing and using larger size needles, pick up 38(42-46) stitches evenly along Yoke edge (Fig. 2). Repeat Rows 1-4 of Lace Yoke until Sleeve measures 10", ending by working a wrong side row.

Change to smaller size needles. Work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for 1½". Bind off loosely in ribbing; cut yarn.

Repeat for second Sleeve.

FINISHING

With right sides together, sew Sleeve or underarm ribbing and side in one continuous seam. Weave in all yarn ends.

Finished Measurement:	35"	39"	43"

Size Note: Instructions are written for size Small with Medium and Large sizes in parentheses. Sweaters are designed with at least 3" ease at the bust. Instructions will be easier to read, if you circle all the numbers pertaining to your size.

MATERIALS: Worsted weight yarn, approximately:
8(9-10) ounces, [230(260-280) grams]
Straight knitting needles, sizes 9 (5.5 mm) and
17 (12.5 mm) or sizes needed for gauge
Yarn needle

GAUGE: In Stockinette Stitch, using larger size needle for all knit rows, and smaller size needle for all purl rows,
5 stitches = 2"

BODY

LOWER BAND

Using smaller size needles, cast on 44(48-54) stitches loosely. Knit every row for 2".

FRONT

Row 1: Using larger size needle, knit across.

Row 2: Using smaller size needle, purl across.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 13" from cast on edge or desired length to underarm.

Next 2 Rows: Work across in established pattern, add on 8(10-12) stitches loosely for Sleeve (Figs. 1a & 1b, page 1): 60(68-78) stitches.

Continue working in established pattern until piece measures approximately $6\frac{3}{4}(7\frac{1}{4}-7\frac{3}{4})$ " from beginning of Sleeve, ending by working a purl row.

SHOULDER BAND

Using smaller size needles, knit every row for 1".

Next Row: Knit 18(22-27) stitches, bind off 24 stitches very loosely for Neck, knit remaining stitches.

Next Row: Knit across to bound off stitches, add on 24 stitches loosely for Neck, knit remaining stitches: 60(68-78) stitches.

Knit every row for 1", ending by working a wrong side row.

BACK

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 of Front until piece measures approximately $6\frac{3}{4}(7\frac{1}{4}-7\frac{3}{4})$ " from Shoulder Band.

Next 2 Rows: Bind off 8(10-12) stitches loosely, work across: 44(48-54) stitches.

Continue working in established pattern until piece measures 11" from Sleeve bind off row.

LOWER BAND

Using smaller size needles, knit every row for 2". Bind off loosely; cut yarn.

SLEEVE BAND

Note: Either side can be right side (see Front cover).

With right side facing and using smaller size needles, pick up 42(44-47) stitches along Sleeve edge (Fig. 2, page 1). Knit every row for 1". Bind off loosely; cut yarn.

Repeat for second Sleeve. 44 - 17 1/2"

FINISHING

With right sides together, sew Sleeve and side in one continuous seam. Weave in all yarn ends.

3. GARTER RIDGE

Finished Measurement:	35"	39"	43"

Size Note: Instructions are written for size Small with Medium and Large sizes in parentheses. Sweaters are designed with at least 3" ease at the bust. Instructions will be easier to read, if you circle all the numbers pertaining to your size.

MATERIALS: Worsted weight yarn, approximately:
10(11-12) ounces, [280(310-340) grams]
Straight knitting needles, sizes 8 (5.0 mm) and
13 (9.0 mm) or sizes needed for gauge
Yarn needle

GAUGE: With larger size needles in Stockinette Stitch,
10 stitches = 3"

BODY

LOWER RIBBING

Using smaller size needles, cast on 58(64-72) stitches loosely. Work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for 2".

FRONT

Rows 1-4: Using smaller size needles, knit across (Garter Ridge).

Row 5: Using larger size needles, knit across.

Row 6: Purl across.

Rows 7-10: Repeat Rows 5 and 6, twice.

Repeat Rows 1-10 until piece measures 14" from cast on edge or desired length to underarm.

Next 2 Rows: Work across in established pattern, add on 14(16-18) stitches loosely for Sleeve (Figs. 1a & 1b, page 1): 86(96-108) stitches.

Continue working in established pattern until piece measures approximately $6\frac{1}{4}(6\frac{3}{4}-7\frac{1}{4})$ " from beginning of Sleeve.

SHOULDER RIBBING

Using smaller size needles, work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for $1\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Next Row: Work 26(31-37) stitches in established ribbing, bind off 34 stitches loosely for Neck, work across in established ribbing.

Next Row: Work across in established ribbing to bound off stitches, add on 34 stitches loosely for Neck, work remaining stitches in established ribbing: 86(96-108) stitches.

Continue working in ribbing for $1\frac{1}{2}$ ".

BACK

Matching Garter Ridge rows, work Back same as Front until piece measures approximately $6\frac{1}{4}(6\frac{3}{4}-7\frac{1}{4})$ " from Shoulder Ribbing and Sleeves match at underarm.

Next 2 Rows: Bind off 14(16-18) stitches loosely, work across: 58(64-72) stitches.

Continue working in established pattern until piece measures 12" from Sleeve bind off row.

RIBBING

Using smaller size needles, work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for 2". Bind off loosely; cut yarn.

SLEEVE RIBBING

With right side facing and using smaller size needles, pick up 42(44-47) stitches along Sleeve edge (Fig. 2, page 1). Work in knit 1, purl 1 ribbing for 2". Bind off loosely in ribbing; cut yarn. Repeat for second Sleeve.

FINISHING

With right sides together, sew Sleeve and side in one continuous seam. Weave in all yarn ends.

CROCHETED BOOTIE COVER

(Shown on page 10)

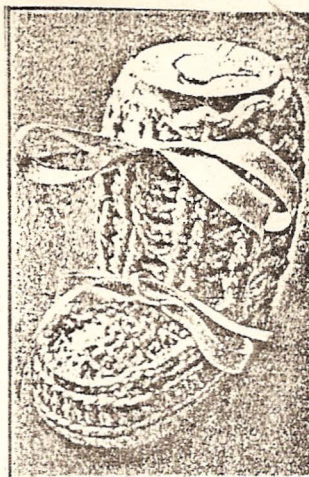
MATERIALS: Lion Brand "Printelle" 3 oz or ball Floral; crochet hook, Size H or ANY SIZE HOOK WHICH WILL OBTAIN THE STITCH GAUGE BELOW; 2 yds white 1/2" ribbon; 1 container Baby Wet Ones®.

GAUGE: 4 sc = 1"; 4 sc rows = 1".

DIRECTIONS—Sole: 3 dc: Starting at center, ch 16 to measure 4 inches. Rnd 1: 3 dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next 11 ch, 7 dc in last ch; working along opposite side of starting chain, dc in next 11 ch, 3 dc where first 3 dc were made. Join with sl st to top of ch-3 36 dc, counting first ch-3 as 1 dc. Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in joining, 2 sc in each of next 2 dc, sc in next 13 dc, 2 sc in each of next 5 dc — toe; sc in next 13 dc, 2 sc in each of next 2 dc. Join to first sc — 46 sc. Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in joining and next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc around, increasing 5 sc evenly spaced across toe, end with 2 sc in last sc. Join — 53 sc. Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in joining, sc in each sc around, increasing 7 sc evenly spaced across toe. Join — 60 sc. **Side Piece—**Rnd 1: Ch3, skip joining, dc in back loop of each sc around (front loops form a ridge on right side of work). Join to top of ch-3. Rnd 2: Sc in back loop of each dc. Join. Rnd 3: Repeat rnd 1. Rnd 4: Repeat rnd 2. Break off and fasten. **Instep:** Skip first 24 sc, attach yarn to next sc, ch3, dc in next sc and in next 10 sc — 12 dc counting ch-3 as 1 Ch1, turn. Next row: Sc in front loop of each dc and in top of ch-3 sc. Following Row: Working in back loops only, repeat row 1 of Instep. Repeat last 2 rows once, then work 1 more sc row. Break off and fasten. Sew side seams of instep in place. Sl st along one side seam, front and other side seam of instep. Break off and fasten. Attach yarn to center back of last row of sole, and working in the free loops made by the 1st row of side piece, sl st in each st around. Join, break off and fasten. Cut a cardboard sole, same size as crocheted sole and place inside bootie. **Upper:** With right side facing, attach yarn to center back of last row of side piece. Rnd 1: Ch3, work 13 dc evenly spaced across last row of side piece, 12 dc in back loop of the 12 sts of instep, 14 dc across other side of side piece. Join—40 dc. Rnd 2: Ch3, yo

hook twice, insert hook from back to front around bar of next dc yo and draw loop through (there are 4 loops on hook)(draw yarn through 2 loops) 3 times a back-tr made; yo hook twice, insert hook from front to back around bar of next dc, yo and draw loop through, and complete a tr as before—a front-tr made; make a front-tr around bar of next dc, *back-tr around bar of each of next 2 dc, front-tr around bar of each of next 2 dc. Rep from * around. Join. Rnd 2: Ch2, back-tr around bar of next tr, make a front-tr around bar of each front-tr, back-tr around bar of each back-tr around. Join. Rep rnd 2 until length is same as can when inserted in bootie. **Last Rnd:** Ch 1, * in next front-tr make sc and dc, in next front-tr make dc and sc, skip next 2 back-tr. Rep from * around. Join. Break off and fasten. **Finishing:** Using remaining yarn or cottonwool, stuff front of bootie.

Lace 1 yd of ribbon through top rnd of upper and 1 yd of ribbon through 1st rnd of upper Baby Wet Ones® and tie in front to a bow.

COATS & CLARK'S "RED HEART" KNITTING WORSTED, 4 Ply ("Tangle-Proof" Pull-Out Skeins): 4 ozs. of No. 676 Emerald Green.

Crochet Hook Size H.

GAUGE: 4 sc = 1 inch.

TOP . . . Starting at center, ch 4. Join with sl st to form ring. **1st rnd:** 7 sc in ring. Do not join rnds unless specified; but mark last st of each rnd. **2nd rnd:** 2 sc in each sc around—14 sc. **3rd rnd:** * Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc (1 sc increased). Repeat from * around—21 sc. **4th rnd:** * Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc. Repeat from * around—28 sc. **Next 8 rnds:** Sc in each sc around, increasing 7 sc evenly spaced on each rnd being careful incs do not fall over each other—84 sc at end of 12th rnd and piece measures about 6¾ inches in diameter. **13th rnd:** Sc in each sc around. **14th rnd:** Sl st loosely in each sc. Join with sl st to first sl st. Ch 1, turn and with wrong side facing, work sl st in each sc around. Join to first sl st made on this rnd. Ch 1, turn.

SIDE . . . 1st rnd: Working in the sl sts of last rnd, sc in same place as last sl st, sc in next st, * ch 5, sc in next 4 sts. Repeat from * around ending with sc in last 2 sts—21 loops with 4 sc between. Do not join rnds. **2nd rnd:** Skip next sc, * sc in back loop of next sc, sc in next 2 ch, 3 sc in next ch—point, sc in 2 ch, sc in back loop of next sc, skip 2 sc. Repeat from * around, ending with sc in last 2 ch of last loop, sc in back loop of next sc. **3rd rnd:** * Picking up back loop only throughout, skip next 2 sc, sc in next 3 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc. Repeat from * around. **Next 9 rnds:** Repeat 3rd rnd. **13th rnd:** Skip next 2 sc, sc in back loop of next 2 sc, * sc in both loops of next 3 sc across point, skip next 6 sc. Repeat from * around. **14th rnd:** Skip next 5 sc between first and last points, (insert hook in next sc and pull loop through) twice; yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook, * insert hook in same sc where last loop was pulled through and pull loop through, insert hook in next sc and pull loop through, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook. Repeat from * around—63 sts. Join, ch 1, turn and work sl st in each st around. Join, ch 1, turn.

FACING . . . Pick up back loop only of each st for remainder of hat. **1st rnd:** Sc in 3 sl sts, h dc in next 5 sl sts, dc in remaining 55 sts. **Next 3 rnds:** Dc in each st around. Turn hat wrong side out; fold facing up against side. There are 21 holes formed by ch-5's on first rnd of side. On next rnd, the center st of each ch-5 is worked in. **5th rnd:** H dc in next 3 dc, sc in next 5 dc, * ch 5 loosely, sc in center st of next ch-5, ch 5 loosely, skip 2 sts on last rnd, sc in next st. Repeat from * around. Join, break off and fasten. Turn right side out.

WASHING INSTRUCTIONS: Hand wash in cold or lukewarm water using a mild soap. Rinse thoroughly in cold water. Squeeze out excess water by hand. Do not wring. Lay flat to dry. Do not hang to dry or dry in direct sunlight.

(Canadian Needle No. 6)

OR ANY SIZE NEEDLE THAT WILL GIVE
THE STITCH GAUGE GIVEN BELOW

GAUGE: 5 sts = 1 inch 7 rows = 1 inch

STYLE A

STRIPING PATTERN: Work in stockinette st as follows: (4 rows M C, 2 rows Color A, 4 rows M C, 2 rows Color B) twice, (4 rows M C, 3 rounds Color A, 4 rounds M C, 3 rounds Color B) twice, (4 rounds M C, 4 rounds Color A, 4 rounds M C, 4 rounds Color B) twice, 3 rounds M C. Starting at neck edge and using M C, cast on 44 sts. Work back and forth in striping pattern as follows: Row 1:

P 11, (put a marker on needle, P 11) 3 times. Row 2: Inc 1 st in first st, (K to 1 st before next marker, inc 1 st in each of next 2 sts) 3 times, K to last st; inc 1 st in last st — 8 sts inc. Row 3: Purl. Repeat the last 2 rows 8 times more, ending with Row 2 — 116 sts. Put a marker on needle and join. Then K round and round, inc 1 st each side of each marker every other round until there are 98 sts between each group of markers, ending with an even round. Bind off.

COLLAR: With right side facing you and using M C, pick up 46 sts across neck edge. Knit 1 row. Row 1: K 3, P 20, put a marker on needle, P 20, K 3. Row 2: Knit. Row 3: K 3, purl to last 3 sts, K 3. Row 4: K 2, inc 1 st in next st, K to 1 st before marker, inc 1 st in each of next 2 sts, K to last 4 sts, inc 1 st in next st, K 3 — 4 sts inc. Row 5: K 3, purl to last 3 sts, K 3. Repeat the last 4 rows 3 times more, ending with Row 4. Then work even in garter st for 6 rows (3 ridges). Bind off.

FINISHING: Using M C, work 1 row s c around front and lower edges. **FRINGE:** Cut strands of M C, Colors A and B 6 inches long. Knot 1 strand of each color in every 4th st around lower edge. Cut strands of M C 6 inches long. Knot 3 strands in centre st between other fringe. **TIES:** Make 2. Using 3 colors, make a ch 9 inches long and sew to neck. Steam lightly.

STYLE B

Using one color ONLY, work in same manner as Style A.

Angels Give Evergreens a Spirited Touch

CROCHET a whole host of these heavenly figures from Nancy Rhodes of Lake Pleasant, New York...and watch your tree take on a meaningful glow.

"I call them 'thumbnail angels' because they're so small," reveals Nancy. "Each is crocheted in one piece and takes less than an hour from start to finish."

Materials Needed (for one angel):

One ball of size 10 crochet cotton—white or ecru

Size 1 (3.00mm) steel crochet hook

Cotton ball or polyester stuffing for head

6 inches of 1/8-inch-wide satin ribbon in color of choice (optional)

One 1/4-inch-diameter ribbon rose in color of choice (optional)

6 inches of metallic cord for hanger

Small safety pin or contrasting thread

Finished Size: Each crocheted angel is about 2-3/4 inches tall x 1-1/2 inches across.

Gauge: 7 sc = 1 inch.

Special Stitches:

SINGLE CROCHET DECREASE (sc dec): Draw up a lp in each of next two sts, yarn over and draw through all lps on hk. One sc dec made.

V-STITCH SHELL (V-st Sh): Work dc, ch 1, dc in same stitch or space as directed.

Directions:

Notes: Head is worked in continuous rounds; do not join. Mark rounds with safety pin or thread. Work picots tightly to help make the wings stand up.

HEAD: Round 1: Ch 3, work 7 sc in third ch from hk.

Round 2: Work 2 sc in each st: 14 sc.

Rounds 3-4: Sc in each st around: 14 sc.

Round 5: * Sc in next 2 sts, work 1 sc dec over next 2 sc; repeat from * around until 8 sts remain.

Stuff head with cotton ball or polyester stuffing.

WINGS AND BODICE: Round 6: Sl st in next st, ch 4, dc in same st (counts as first V-st Sh), work 1 V-st Sh in each st around. Join with sl st in third ch of beginning ch-4: 8 V-st Shs.

Round 7: Sl st to first ch-sp, * work 3 dc in ch-sp, ch 3, sl st in third ch from hk (picot made), work 3 dc in same sp; sc in sp between V-st Shs *; repeat between *s two more times; work 3 scs across next V-st Sh. Repeat between *s three times, work 3 scs across next V-st Sh.

DRESS: Round 8:

Holding all other stitches out of the way and working across the two sets of scs only, ch 4, dc in first sc (counts as first V-st Sh), work 1 V-st Sh in each sc around. Join with sl st in ch 3 of beginning ch: 6 V-st Shs.

Round 9: Sl st to first ch-1 sp of V-st Sh, ch 4, dc in same st (counts as first V-st Sh); work 1 V-st Sh in each ch-1 sp and between each V-st Sh: 12 V-st Shs.

Rounds 10-12: Work 1 V-st Sh in each V-st Sh around: 12 V-st Shs.

Rounds 13-14: Sc in each st around. Sl st in next st and fasten off.

FINISHING: Stitch a ribbon rose and/or a small bow to angel's bodice as shown in photo below.

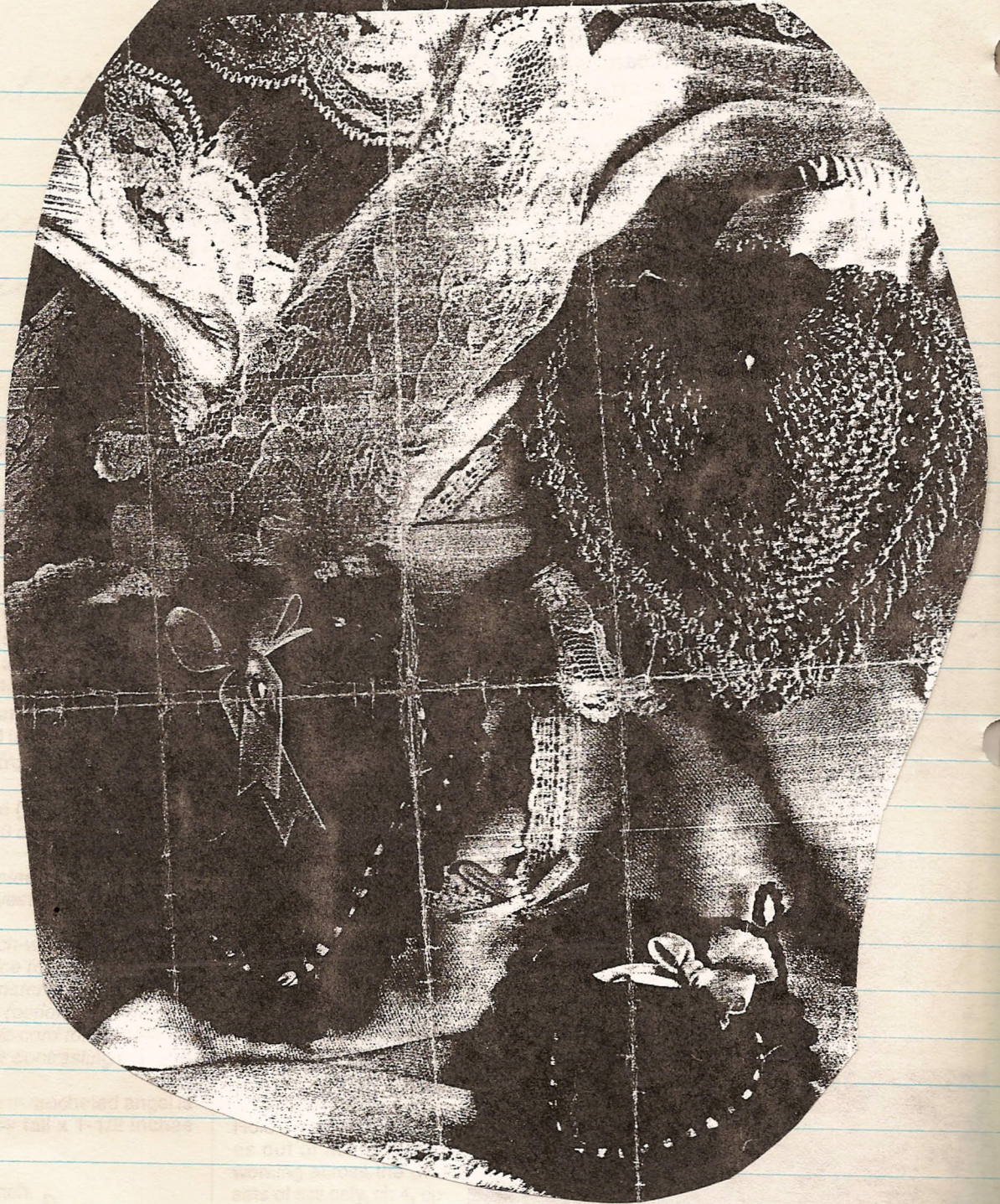
Tie gold cord in overhand knot and stitch to back of head for hanger.

PINEAPPLE HEARTS



These pineapple hearts are full of sentiment. Traditional crochet stitches deliver a nostalgic message. Make them as sachets (filled with potpourri) or as decorative hanging ornaments. For a secret friend to tuck in a drawer, to send to your Valentine, or your contribution to a wedding party—hearts are smart year 'round.

SIZE

When stuffed, large heart measures about 4½ in. across, small heart is 3 in.

MATERIALS

- J & P Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen crochet cotton size 10 (150-yd. ball): 1 ball No. 126 red or your color choice will make 2 large hearts
- Size 7 steel crochet hook
- ½ yd. of ¼-in.-wide ribbon for each heart
- 5 x 10 in. piece of fabric, same color as crochet thread, for lining
- Small amount polyester stuffing
- Matching color sewing thread, hand sewing supplies

STITCHES USED

Chain, slip stitch, single crochet, double crochet, treble crochet

GAUGE

Over dc: 9 dc = 1 in., 4½ rows = 1 in.

DIRECTIONS

Large Heart:

- Ch 25, join with sl st to form ring.
- Rnd 1: Ch 3, make dc, ch 2, 2 dc in ring, *ch 3, make 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc

in ring (shell made), ch 1, 20 tr in ring, ch 1, * 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in ring; rep from * to * once more, join with sl st in top of beg ch-3.

- Rnd 2: Sl st in next dc and in sp, ch 3, make dc, ch 2, 2 dc in sp of shell (starting shell in shell made), *ch 3, sk ch-3 sp, make 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp (shell in shell made), ch 2, tr in first tr, (ch 1, tr in next tr) 19 times, ch 2*, shell in sp of next shell; rep from * to * once more, join in top of beg ch-3 on starting shell.

- Rnd 3: *(Shell in shell, ch 3) twice, sc in first ch-1 sp, (ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp) 18 times, ch 3; rep from * around, join.

- Rnd 4: *(Shell in shell, ch 3) twice, sk 3 ch, sc in first ch-3 sp of pineapple, (ch 3, sc in next ch-3 lp) 17 times, ch 3; rep from * around join.

- Rnds 5-20: Continue in same manner as Rnd 4, holding work so right side of pineapples is on outside. there will be 1 less ch-3 lp on each rnd until only 1 ch-3 lp remains on pineapple on Rnd 20.

- Rnd 21: Make starting shell in shell, ch 3, shell over next shell, dc in remaining ch-3 lp on pineapple, 2 dc in next shell, ch 1, sl st from back in sp of 2nd shell, ch 1, 2 more dc in 3rd shell, ch 3, 2 dc in next shell, ch 1, sl st from back in sp of first shell on rnd, ch 1, 2 more dc in 4th shell, dc in last lps of pineapple, sl st in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

Small Heart:

- Ch 20, join with sl st to form ring.

- Rnds 1 & 2: Work as for large heart, making 12 tr in place of 20 tr.

- Rnd 3: Like large heart, with 10 ch-3 lps to start pineapples.

- Rnds 4-12: Continue like large heart until only one ch-3 lp remains on pineapple.

- Rnd 13: Same as Rnd 21 of large heart.

Lining pattern:

- Lay flattened heart on plain paper. Use pin or needle to prick through paper between inner ch-3 bars next to shells. Draw heart shape around marked points, having straight line across top, about ½ in. above center of starting edge of Rnd 1.

- Use paper pattern to cut 2 lining pieces. Right sides together, stitch around curved edges by hand or machine with small seam allowance, leaving top open for stuffing. Turn right side out, baste under raw edge of opening with double strand of sewing thread and small running sts. Do not fasten off, but leave needle and thread hanging loose to use as drawstring later.

Ribbon:

- Starting at lower point of pineapple, run ribbon over center dc and through sps up each side. Hold matching ch-3 bars of bottom and top together so both layers are joined.

Stuffing:

- Push lining bag between crocheted layers through opening. Stuff heart, draw up top edge and fasten off.

Finishing:

- Pull ribbon ends over front and across each other under 2 center tr of Rnd 1, tie in bow. Use additional ribbon to make hanging lp, or crochet one as directed below.

Hanging Loop (Optional):

- Attach thread with 2 sc between shells of Rnd 1 at one side, ch 4, turn, dc in 2nd sc. (Ch 4, turn, dc in 2nd dc) 4 times, make 2 sc between shells on opposite side. Fasten off.

Helix Striped Cap

If I had to think of the perfect cap in terms of the actual knitting, it would contain no ribbing, no purling, no sewing up, and no gazillion yarn ends to darn in. This cap eliminates all of these and looks great to boot. Made in 3 colors and ending in three I-Cord tassels at the top, it has a rolled brim at the bottom. Although the cap is striped, there is no color jog at the change of colors with this method of knitting. Sized for a small child. See note at the end for a larger cap.

Materials:

Yarn: Approximately 2 oz/56.7 g worsted wt yarn in each of three colors, A, B, and C.

Needles: 6 US/4.25 mm 16" circular needles

7 US/4.5 mm 16" circular needles or size needed to obtain gauge

7 US/4.5 mm double pointed needles

Gauge: 4-1/2 sts = 1"/2.5 cm on 7 US/4.5 mm needles

Finished Dimensions:

Approximately 17-3/4"/45 cm around.

See note at the end for a larger cap.

Directions:

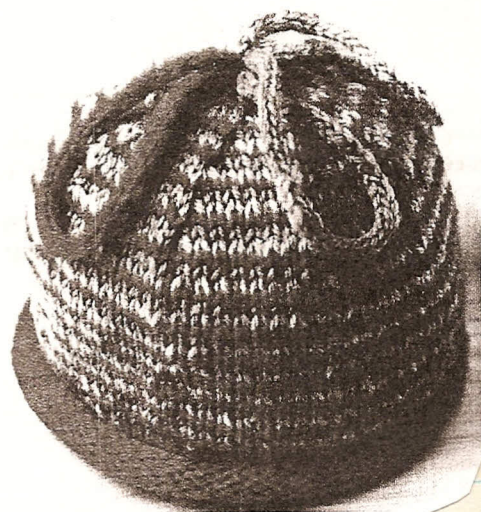
With 6 US/4.25 mm needle, and Color A, cast on 81 sts. Join being careful not to twist. Place marker for beginning of round.

Knit around for 3"/7.6 cm.

Change to 7 US/4.5 mm needles.

Introduce colors B & C as follows:

Knit 27 sts in Color A, drop yarn, knit next 27 sts in Color B, drop yarn, knit 27 sts in Color C.



Keep knitting around, picking up each new strand as you come to it. Don't twist the yarns. No hole will develop, but do try to keep your tension even when switching colors. Snug the yarn up but don't pull it too tightly.

Check after several rounds and see if you are working too loose or too tight. Notice that when you come to the end of the round, you will work the first 27 sts of the next round with the same color you just used. Just remember to change yarns where the new strand lies.

Knit around in this mode until total piece measures 7-1/2"/19 cm.

Decrease Rounds for Top: Maintaining color changes, work as follows:

Dec Rnd 1: K7, k2tog around.

Knit one round.

Dec Rnd 2: K6, k2tog around.

Knit one round.

Dec Rnd 3: K5, k2tog around.

Knit one round.

Decrease in this manner every other round having 1 less st between decreases each time until you have 9 sts left. Change to dpns as needed. You will have 3 sts each of three colors left.

Place 2 colors on a holder. Knit I-Cord (see below) on the three sts of one color for about 8"/21 cm. Bind off. Do the same on each of the other two colors.

Cut a length of yarn 16"/40.6 cm in length and double it. Tie the top I-cords together at the base. Darn in the few yarn ends.

Note: You can make the cap larger by using larger needles and working to 8-8-1/2"/21-21.6 cm from bottom. At a gauge of 4 sts = 1"/2.5 cm, the cap will measure 20"/50.8 cm around. When you finish, give the "seams" a tug, up and down and across to even out the stitches. Take a look, no color jog!

I-Cord: Place 3 sts on dpn and slide them to one end having yarn tail on your left. *Knit the three sts, bringing the yarn from left side. Do not turn. Slide the sts to the end of the needle and repeat from *. The yarn will always be coming from the left side producing a tiny tube. Work to desired length.

Marie's Mountain Medicine Hat

This hat is sized for a baby slightly older than a newborn. Use machine washable yarn for easy cleaning. Make hats with one or many colors, with or without the "ears." Have fun and play!

Materials:

Yarn: Approximately 150 yds/137.6 m worsted weight yarn

Needles: 6 US/4.25 mm 16"/40 cm circular
6 US/4.25 mm set of 4 or 5 double pointed needles for the top of the hat and for the ears.

Gauge: 4.5 sts = 1"/2.5 cm

Finished Dimensions:

To fit 0-3 month baby

Directions:

Hat without ears: Cast on 80 stitches. Join being careful not to twist. Place marker at the beginning of the round.

Bottom Band:

Purl one round.

Knit one round.

Purl one round.

Knit one round.

Purl one round.

Start stockinette stitch (knit every row in the round).

Work one round increasing 4 stitches. (84 sts)

Pattern: *Knit 3 rows, purl 1 row* repeat between *s until you have 7 ridges (the purl row makes one ridge).



Start decreasing as follows, changing to dpns when necessary:

Round 1: K1, K 2tog, K7, SSK

Round 2: Knit 1 row

Round 3: K1, K2tog, K5, SSK

Round 4: Purl 1 row

Round 5: K1, K2tog, K3, SSK

Round 6: Knit 1 row

Round 7: K1, K2tog, K1, SSK

Round 8: Purl 1 row

K1, K2tog all around until you have 3 or 4 stitches.

Now make I-cord the length of the hat.

Finish loose ends.

Hat with Ears - Start by making 2 ears:

With double pointed needles, cast on 3 stitches and make an I-cord long enough to tie a bow, at least 12"/30.5 cm).

When the cord is long enough, start garter stitch, increasing in this manner:

Knit 1, increase 1. K to last stitch, increase 1, K1.

Now you have 5 stitches.

Knit one row.

Continue increasing every other row until you have 15 stitches.

Continue in garter stitch (knit every row) until you have 15 ridges. (1 ridge = 2 rows)

Knit one more row. Leave stitches on needle.

Make another ear. Leave on needle.

Using the circular needle, and starting at back of hat, cast on 11 stitches.

Pick up and knit 15 stitches from one ear, cast on 28 stitches for front of hat, pick up and knit 15 stitches from 2nd ear, then cast on 11 stitches, place marker. (80 sts) Join stitches in a circle being careful not to twist.

Knit 3 rows, purl 1 row repeat between *s until you have 7 ridges (the purl row makes one ridge)

Start decreasing as the hat without "ears" and finish in the same manner.

Scrubbies

Use:

K hook, nylon net 72 " wide, (1/3 yard per scrubby)

Instructions:

Cut 5 strips of 2 " wide net.

Tie first 2 strips together.

Chain 6 stitches and join in a circle.

Single crochet 2 stitches in every stitch around for 2 strips. (I go around 2 times this way)

Two 4½" squares of contrasting fabric
Small amount of Velcro®

METHOD:

Turn raw edge of one end of the ribbon under ¼" and sew Velcro® on top, using matching thread; 1" further up the ribbon, sew another piece of Velcro®; attach scissors in the loop created.

Prepare Cathedral Pocket. For each 10" square: Fold square into a rectangle, right sides together. Sew ¼" seam allowance at each end. (Figure 1.)

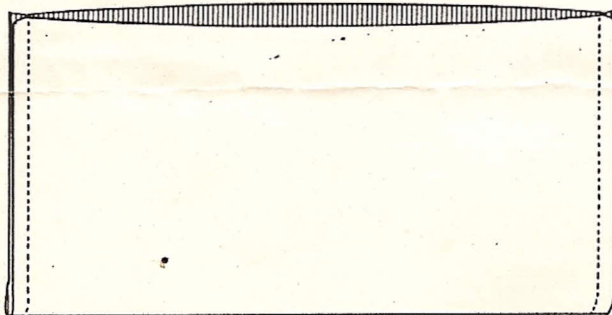

Pull the rectangle open at points A and B; bring C and D together; pin at intersection, letting piece fall into a triangle. (Figure 2.) Sew across the top, leaving a 2" opening at the center. (Figure 3.) Turn right side out, press, stagger seams at the center, and slip stitch opening closed.

Find midpoint of each side. Connect these points, drawing a square within the square with a pencil or other marking device.

Center a Velcro® strip just inside one of the newly marked lines on the seamless side of one square. Do the same on the second square, but this time catch the free end of the grosgrain ribbon under the strip. Machine stitch each strip into place.

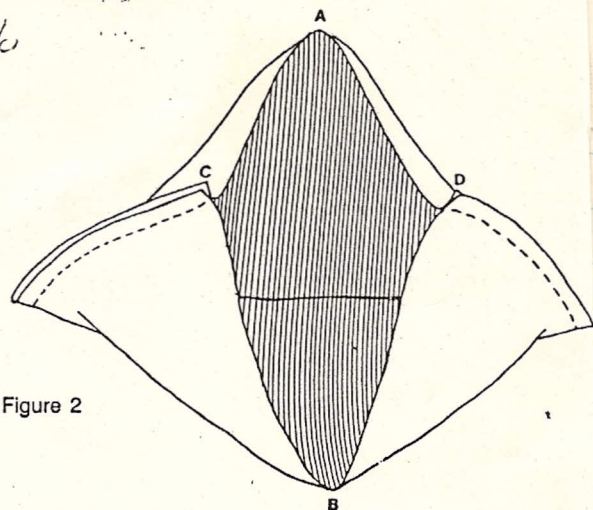

Align the two squares, seamless sides together. Machine stitch together in U shape formed by three marked lines, leaving open the line on which the Velcro® was attached. (Figure 4.)


Place a 4½" square of contrasting fabric on each side of the square, lining up at the marked lines.

On each side, fold the four bordering triangles down over the new patch. Connect their tips. (Figure 5.)

Turn each bias edge back, revealing the inside color. Taking care not to go through to the pocket inside, slip stitch the curves in place. (A piece of cardboard placed in the pocket will help you avoid stitching through the pocket.) Whip stitch at the outside corner of each curve to conceal raw edges. (Figure 6.)

Directions:

For body, make 2 (one body color and from the blanket color)
Row 1 - Ch 19, SC in 2nd Ch from hook, Sc in each St across, Ch 1 and turn.
Row 2 - SC in each St across (18 sts).
Repeat until piece measures 5" across and 6 " long. Fasten off. Make 2nd piece like first except use other color.

Legs - Make 2. Ch 21 join in first Ch to form a circle. Row 1 - Ch 1, SC in each St around, do not join, but work around and around for 16 rows. Fasten off. Make 2nd one like the first.

For the arms - Make 2. Ch 16 join to first Ch to form a circle. Work in SC around, do not join, until piece measures 2" wide and 3½" long. Make a ruffle on the edge as follows: *SC, Ch 1, Sk 1 St. In next St make 4 DC with a Ch between each DC, Ch 1, Sk 1 St, SC in next St, repeat from * around, join and fasten off. (4 shells) Insert hands into arms, glue in place. Stuff arm and sew top edges together. Make 2nd arm same as first one.

For the bonnet - Chain 38 St. Join to form a circle. Work in SC around for 14 rows. Gather top and trim with the larger 2" pom pom. On the other edge make a shell edge same as for the sleeves but leave a 3" space for the back of the bonnet. Make a chain and attach on both sides for the bonnet ties under the chin. Now sew 2 pieces of the body together around 3 sides. Stuff and sew the 4th side together. The blanket color should be on the outside. Do not attach head, legs & arms until the blanket has been finished.

Blanket can be made two different ways.

Blanket One - Attach yarn at any corner. Ch 3, DC, Ch 2, 2 DC in same St. Make 1 DC in each St to next corner. *Make 2 DC in corner St, Ch 2, 2 DC* in same St. Continue around making increase in each corner as indicated from * - *. On the 4th corner Sl St to corner sp. Chain 3 and continue as above until 2 skeins are used. Be sure to end in the beginning corner. Fasten off. Attach the left over yarn from making the body and make a shell edging all around and fasten off. (Same as the edging on arms and bonnet.)

Blanket Two - Attach yarn on middle side of body and work as above, having your corner on each side of the body and at each end. It takes about 8 or 9 rows in this manner before piece tends to lay flat. Put styro ball behind doll face. Glue and pin in place. Glue bonnet onto head. Let dry. Now sew arms, legs and head into place. Fold blanket over baby.

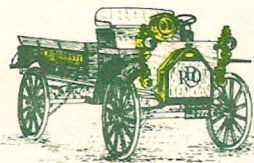

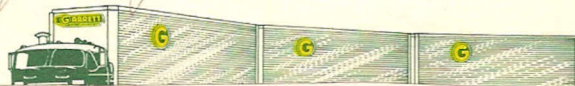
